Improving Mental Health for New Yorkers Living with Disability



The **New York State (NYS) Department of Health** is pleased to announce the release of a new infographic based on 2021 data from the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System.

The infographic, titled *Improving Mental Health for New Yorkers Living with Disability*, illustrates the relationship between poor physical, social, and mental health, and demonstrates the significant disparities in health outcomes among adults living with disabilities.

According to the report, nearly one-quarter (24.4%) of adults living with disabilities experience frequent mental distress. Additionally, adults living with disabilities are three times more likely to report being diagnosed with a depressive disorder and four times more likely to have considered suicide in the past year than adults who do not live with disabilities. Furthermore, adults living with disabilities are seven times more likely to report frequent poor physical health, five times more likely to report activity limitations due to poor health, and four times more likely to report having two or more chronic conditions, such as diabetes, heart disease, hypertension, arthritis, cancer, stroke, or asthma than adults living without disabilities.

Wayne County Cornell Cooperative Extension (CCE) is Looking for Board Members

Are you interested in keeping **4-H** a top priority for children in Wayne County? Do you benefit from the Master Gardener's Program, or have an interest in accessible nutrition information for all Wayne County residents? Want to keep up with the latest on the many agricultural commodities produced in Wayne County, like apples, peaches, dairy, field crops, vegetables, berries, and others? Then apply for an open seat on the Board of Directors of CCE of Wayne County.

Meetings are held about every other month on the second Tuesday, in the evening. CCE Wayne serves all of the citizens of Wayne County in the areas of agriculture, agriculture education, youth, and family development (including 4-H),sustainability of the environment (including Master Gardeners), nutrition and food safety, and healthy communities. There are 4 agriculture specialist teams for which CCE Wayne gains access to education and research for our farms: NWNY Dairy, Livestock and Field Crops Team, Cornell Vegetable Team, Lake Ontario Fruit Team, and the Finger Lakes Grape Team. More information about our Plan of Work can be found on our website, "ccewayne.org" and then "about us".

The Board of Directors is the governing board of CCE Wayne and works in partnership with county and state governments and Cornell University. The board of directors supports the Executive Director in developing CCE Wayne's strategy, helps to evaluate programs, and oversees funding for the organization's operation and programming. Board membership is a three-year commitment with a potential for re-election for one additional term. Board volunteers must be residents of Wayne County and at least 18 years of age. Other requirements are listed in the Constitution that can be found on the website under "About Us", then "Board and Governance".

Board members are expected to prepare for and attend board meetings, as well as participate in working committees as needed. Elections for board members will take place at the annual meeting on Friday, November 8, 2024 at the Wayne County CCE Extension Building, 1581 Route 88 North, Newark, NY 14513. Cornell Cooperative Extension provides equal employment and program opportunities. Individuals who bring a diverse perspective and are supportive of diversity and equality are strongly encouraged to apply. The State of Youth Mental Health

In 2021, U.S. Surgeon General Vivek Murthy released the Surgeon General's Advisory on Protecting Youth Mental Health, calling for a swift and comprehensive response to the youth mental health crisis.

62% increase in suicide

New York State Commission on National and Community Service

New National Initiative Addresses Youth Mental Health

The New York State Commission on National and Community Service has been awarded a \$100,000 grant from the Schultz Family Foundation and Pinterest to develop a Youth Mental Health Corps to help youth access critical mental health resources.

The new **Youth Mental Health Corps** is an innovative, public-private collaboration that will address the growing needs of young people while creating career pathways through **AmeriCorps** service to address the national shortage of mental health professionals. Corps members will be trained as peer support/recovery navigators serving youth in schools and in community-based organizations.

Corps members – who will include young people who have lived experience with mental health challenges and wish to enter careers in the behavioral health field – will gain valuable on-the-job experience, receive a stipend, and earn a credential to advance their

career. They will also be eligible for education awards to pursue higher education or pay back qualifying student loans.

In addition to New York State, 10 other states are also part of the Youth Mental Health Corps initiative. Hundreds of Corps members will be deployed in Colorado, Michigan, Minnesota and Texas, starting in September 2024. Seven other states – California, Iowa, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Utah, and Virginia - have received planning grants and intend to launch their own Corps in the fall of 2025.

"Governor Hochul has made addressing mental health challenges, particularly those faced by youth, a key focus of her administration," said Linda Cohen, executive director of the NYS Commission on National and Community Service. "We are proud to work in tandem with our many partners, both in New York State government and our extensive network of nonprofits, to address those challenges in a unique and innovative way. We appreciate the confidence that the Schultz and Pinterest foundations have shown in us and are excited to be part of this new national network of state service commissions."
